Please continue to follow the guidelines of local, state, and federal health officials. The common sense precautions they are recommending will go a long way to mitigating the effects of the virus. Now is not the time to let our guard down. It is the time to consider not only what we want to do, but to also consider the needs of others, especially those who are most vulnerable and susceptible to the virus.

Putting our trust in God and doing the things that benefit each other, the actions that I believe God would approve of, will get us through this.




The Men's Bible Study is currently not meeting due to the gathering restrictions of the ongoing pandemic.

This facility at LVH-Cedar Crest is a convenient and affordable "home away from home" that offers comfortable accommodations and a supportive environment for families of patients or patients themselves. It offers a supportive environment that allows the patient to

focus on healing. They are a member of the Healthcare Hospitality Network (HHN), a nationwide network of more than 200 not-for-profit, family lodging facilities that offer warm, caring support to more than a quarter of a million people each year.

Christ is risen! He is risen indeed. Alleluia!

Jesus said, "This is my commandment, That you love one another, as I have loved you." John 13:34

As our response to God's abundant love that he showed to us through the gift of Jesus, grace, forgiveness and everlasting life, Emmanuel's church will be donating items to ACCESS Services for their teens in foster care. ACCESS gets a lot of items for younger children but their teens are often forgotten and overlooked, despite probably needing to know someone cares more than any other group. We are asking for church members to consider showing them Christ's love by donating a gift for them. Think about where teens like to shop or what teens like. Maybe ask a teen that you know where they like to shop or what they would suggest.

Some suggestions are:

- Body wash
- Shampoo
- Tooth paste and tooth brush
- Deodorant
- Body spray
- Fuzzy Blanket/fuzzy socks
- Items with motivational words on them like journals or signs to decorate a teen's room (non-denominational)
- Gift cards to places that teens like to shop(Old Navy, Hollister, American Eagle, anyplace that has a Juniors section etc...) Ask a teen you know where they like to shop.

Our focus is teens, but ACCESS also always needs items for younger children as well including: diapers, formula, new or gently used clothes for children of all ages, car seats and gift cards for emergency placement. Another item that may be needed or helpful are gently used or new books especially with encouraging words or uplifting themes. Again ask a child or teen what their favorite book is and what they would like to read themselves. Think about what your favorite book was when you were young.

How to Donate During Social Distancing

We are still not gathering for worship or activities but there is a way to get your donations to church. During business hours (Monday-Friday, 9am -3pm) the outside side red door into the downstairs parlor vestibule will be unlocked. There will be bins inside the door for you to drop off any items you wish to donate. Please feel free to drop off items at your convenience. In light of COVID-19 (Coronavirus) meeting guidelines, social distancing practices (six feet separation between attendees at tables) were in force for this council meeting.

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by Vice President Pete Coccetti. Pres. Dianna Schoenen had noted she would not be there to get the meeting started, arrived later.

Devotions: Justin Fallenstein led council in prayer and meditation.

Review/Approval of Minutes: Win Miller moved to accept February minutes as presented, seconded by Justin Fallenstein. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report:

- 1. Two congregational delegates needed for Synod Assembly, June 4th 6th. To be held at the Kalahari Resort in the Poconos. May 18th deadline.
- 2. Pastor will be on vacation starting immediately after Easter Sunday.
- 3. Letters of thanks need to be sent to vendors who helped us out with the new kitchen. Huge cost savings were realized.
- 4. Now is the time to review congregational bylaws. New constitutional guidelines are available through the synod.

Financial Secretary Report: Submitted by Bob Bennett.

Treasurer Report: Submitted by Bob Siegfried.

Suggestion Boxes: Suggestions were made to revive the children's choir and ringing the church bell before services on Sunday morning. Also, inclusion of spirited traditional music in the Praise Service. Question raised, has evangelism been replaced with outreach, and should the "Men's" Bible Study simply be open to all?

Open Forum Review: Feb 20, 2020 meeting in the Fellowship Hall regarding where Emmanuel's stands with the Pastoral Call process. Guest speakers Bishop Zeiser and Pastor Peggy Wuertele, Synopsis submitted by Kristin Butz.

Livestreaming Update: Bobby Siegfried discussed needs for improved network infrastructure. To be completed soon, will enable us to share our services and message with the world via the internet.

Coronavirus Discussion: ELCA and CDC guidelines reviewed, and "the new normal" is to be set in place going forward to mitigate spread of disease during our worship services and other gatherings. Under these unusual health circumstances, Chris Wolf moved to suspend meal sharing (soups) at our Lenten Services for this year, seconded by Paul Honett, motion carried. Home service visits (those most susceptible to infection) are to also be suspended for the foreseeable future, as proposed by Chris Wolf and seconded by Win Miller. This motion also carried.

 Karl Monroe to research standing policy in regard to appending to congregational bylaws.

Property:

- No updates. Discussion about thermostat in Fellowship Hall, Committee directed to get another opinion about current problematic unit.
- New Kitchen use: As the new kitchen has been completed and now in service, all food activities in the old kitchen are to be curtailed. Use this beautiful, new gift to our Emmanuel's family!

Women's Group:

 Andrea Roberts started 3rd Monday evening of month Women's Plus Outreach Committee, ideas include getting items for foster children, world hunger, etc. Met March 9, will meet March 16 also. Bingo in April. Requesting to have speakers for group meetings from various organizations.

Youth Ministry:

- Bobby Siegfried lead Youth Group discussion Feb 19, 9 attended followed by Wednesday Lenten service. 3 attended Sky Zone with Hope Lutheran Youth Group on Feb 21. March youth group meeting March 15, Laser tag March 20 with Hope Lutheran.
- Chris Wolf Proposal: Chris Wolf proposed that his wife, Samantha, take up part, if not all, of the paid Youth Ministries position in regard to youth programing and activities leadership. Under council discussion, it was felt that following Pastor Wuertele's recommendations regarding this paid position (see next line) would be the wisest course of action. However, council states that any volunteer activities would be welcomed and appreciated, with review by council.
- Youth Ministry Leader: Pastor Peggy Wuertele recommends Emmanuel's holds off on moving forward with this until new pastor is installed.

New Business:

- Request to Use New Kitchen: Long time members Mike and Terry Koehler have requested occasional weekday usage of the new commercial kitchen while their new catering business location is being completed. Usage would only be a few times to cook side dishes, about three times through mid-May, when they hope they'll be ready to go. Dianna Schoenen moved to permit usage, provided the Koehlers show certificate of insurance, coordinate with church secretary for usage conflicts, and meet with our kitchen committee before actual use. Chris Wolf seconded the motion, which carried unanimously.
- Request to Use the Softball Field: LV Flag Football once again wishes to use our field for sporting events. In the past they have demonstrated insurance coverage, and have been asked to be conscious of parking conflicts with church activities. Win Miller moved to grant usage permission, seconded by Paul Honett. Motion carried.

Next Meeting:

Next council meeting scheduled for April 23, as Maundy Thursday, April 9, would be the next regular meeting date.

Meeting adjournment moved by Win Miller, followed by a second from Marilyn Angst, which carried. Meeting closed in prayer.



Northeastern Pennsylvania Synod, ELCA

Being the Church in a Time of Pandemic

As this article is being written, social distancing and "stay at home" orders in response to the spread of the Coronavirus are preventing our congregations from gathering for face-to-face worship. But in the midst of circumstances that keep people from "going to church," it is heartening to see the ways in which the congregations of the Northeastern Pennsylvania Synod are focusing on God's call to "be the church," bringing a message of hope to their members and their surrounding communities. Leaders are discovering a number of creative ways in which God's people can still "gather" for worship and conversation - via Zoom, Facebook Live, YouTube, email, telephone chains, cars parked at a drive-in movie theater, and other means.

In addition to worship, prayers, and pastoral care for members, congregations are also turning their focus outward to bring tangible expressions of God's presence and love in the midst of extraordinary circumstances to their most vulnerable neighbors. This brief article highlights just two of these outreach ministries, as examples of the kinds of things that are happening in numerous sites across the territory of the Northeastern Pennsylvania Synod.

The Food Pantry at Holy Trinity, Dingmans Ferry



In addition, there are concerns for the safety of both the volunteers who staff the pantry and those who come for food. Barbara reports, "Due to this crisis we have begun a drive-up pantry pick up for our families. Each family receives three bags of non-perishable foods along with a bag of frozen meats, vegetables, butter, fresh fruits and cheese. This has helped us to maintain social distancing as well as keep our volunteers safe."

Every weekday morning, volunteers gather at Holy Trinity Lutheran Church in rural Pike County to prepare bags of food for community members who are food insecure. In the past, typically 85 - 95 families would turn to Holy Trinity each month to supplement their nutritional needs. Food Pantry Director, Barbara Hupner, reports that the number of those turning to the pantry has increased due to the Coronavirus pandemic. And the members of Holy Trinity are responding, even as some of the traditional sources of food - such as donations from individuals or local stores - have decreased.



The Food Pantry at Hope Lutheran Church and Hope's Table, Reading

Hope Lutheran Church in the northwest section of the City of Reading, and its partner ministry, Hope's Table, together host the largest pantry in the Helping Harvest (Berks and Schuylkill Counties) system. Typically, 200+ families are served in the biweekly distribution. Due to neighbors losing their work - and their income - during the pandemic, at the last pantry more than 350 families came for food.

To counter the empty shelves at local groceries stores, the volunteers at Hope's Pantry are committed to providing more items for those who turn to the pantry, rather than less. In addition to the food they receive from Helping Harvest, the congregation has developed partnerships with other congregations, local restaurants, bakeries, and farmers to provide healthy nutritional options for their



guests. They are also collecting other items, such as toilet paper, cleaning products, and soap that that they distribute to families on each Thursday.

Meanwhile, the staff members of Café Esperanza, another ministry birthed by Hope, are offering drive-by or walk-by cooked meals to neighborhood residents

two evenings a week - to supplement the prepared food assistance that is available to families through the Reading School **FRFF**

system.

Delivery is available for those who can't come to the congregation's parking lot. Advertised only through word of mouth and a sign at the church, the response of the community has been notable - both in terms of the growing numbers of those coming for assistance and the growing numbers of those who want to support the ministry!

These two congregations - in different corners of the synod and in two very different contexts - are endeavoring to "be the church" by seeing the face of Jesus in their most vulnerable neighbors in this unprecedented time and responding in love. We know there are many other congregations conducting similar ministries that are also bringing to life Jesus' parable from Matthew 25:31-46, "Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you...." 
