# **Transition Pastor's Report 2020**

When 2020 began no one could have in their wildest dreams, or should I say nightmares, envisioned what we would be facing in less than three months. The year began with much promise and the hope that a settled pastor to lead Emmanuel's would soon be identified. We began in January with a town hall meeting during which a large gathering enthusiastically discussed the results of the Congregational Vitality Surveys which helped us see where we were as a community and formed the basis for brainstorming future possibilities to help us get where we hoped to be in our relationships with God, with each other, and with the wider community when the new pastor came on board.



In February things took a dramatic turn for me as I suffered an attack of Bell's Palsy. Fortunately, I was able to continue to see to my pastoral responsibilities while I recovered. Unfortunately, my bout of Bell's Palsy was but a precursor for how the rest of 2020 would unfold. The emergence and rapid spread of COVID-19 brought about a major shift in our focus from looking for ways to facilitate the transition to finding ways to be and do church in the midst of a pandemic.

In March when we made the decision to briefly suspend in person worship, we all thought that it would only be for a couple of weeks and that we'd all be together again in our building by Easter, but it was not to be. Thanks to their talents and willingness to expend extra time and effort Beth McElroy, Bobby Siegfried, and Lynne Ambrose came together enabling us to offer meaningful, quality online worship opportunities without missing a beat. There was a learning curve for all of us, but together we all made it happen. They, along with our President Dianna Schoenen, and the church council, deserve everyone's thanks for their untiring efforts on behalf of the Emmanuel's family throughout 2020.



As soon as the Lehigh Valley entered into the "green phase" of Pennsylvania's reopening plan in addition to providing both full traditional and contemporary online we began holding outdoor services. We confirmed 12 young people at a special service, attended by approximately 80 people at the pavilion in August. We began celebrating Holy Communion at the outdoor service and as the weather became colder, we transitioned to indoor worship, including Holy Communion as soon as possible while also following the guidance we received from the State of Pennsylvania, the CDC, and the ELCA. We also began celebrating Holy Communion during our online services as well. During one of our indoor services, we welcomed six new members to Emmanuel's.

In October I began meeting with the first-year catechetical class via Zoom. Our focus has been on Luther's Small Catechism and Church History. After the number of COVID cases began to spike and a tremendous strain was placed on the local health care facilities we once again temporarily suspended in person worship and meetings. Realizing that we would not be able to hold our traditional Christmas Eve services we made plans to add a brief outdoor service in addition to the online services. We had over 100 people signup to attend two services, but due to torrential downpours we weren't able to hold the services as planned. Beth, Bobby, and I moved inside and while maintaining an appropriate distance we were able to livestream a service to approximately 60 people who remained in their vehicles. I extend my appreciation to everyone who is or was part of our reopening and our worship committees for all they have done during this stressful and uncertain year, including Michele Geiger who in addition to chairing the worship committee assumed the lead role for the reopening committee.

In July of 2019 I had no idea that I would still be here in January of 2021 and yet here I am. Therefore, I want to highlight some of my experiences in the areas of professional and personal development and enrichment.

- January: two day in person "Extravagant Generosity Stewardship Workshop" sponsored by the Northeastern and Southeastern Pennsylvania Synods.
- May: weeklong online "Festival of Homiletics" series of preaching workshops.
- October: Synod Assembly at which our new Bishop Christopher DeForest was elected and a two-day online workshop "Effective Transitional Leadership Seminar" conducted by the Interim Ministry Network
- November: one half day online workshop "Beyond Difficult People" conducted by the Interim Ministry Network.
- Throughout the year: multiple webinars on the subjects of safely gathering, online giving, and updates from the ELCA and Northeastern Pennsylvania Synod, rostered leaders meetings of the Northern Lehigh Mission District, and meetings of the Bath Area Council of Churches.

Finally, I want to thank all of you for continued faithful support of Emmanuel's. Your generosity has allowed us to weather this long-lasting storm and to continue meeting the needs of our community. If there is one thing I hope all of us have come to realize over the course of 2020 it is that as important as the church building may be it is people, not the building, who are the church. This has not been an easy time for any of us, but if we continue to love the Lord our God with all our heart and with all our soul and with all our mind and our neighbor as ourself we will see that the best is yet to come.



#### **Church Attendance**

Our 2020 worship schedule was a challenge as we navigated our way through a global Covid-19 pandemic. We began the year with our regular full Sunday schedule (8, 9:30, 10:45). This continued through March 8 when we suspended in-person worship due to rising concerns about Covid-19. Online worship services (livestream or pre-recorded) began on March 15 and continued throughout the rest of the year. In-person worship resumed on a limited basis with outdoor services from July through early October when we moved inside. Attendance at these services was restricted based on guidance from the CDC, ELCA and the state of Pennsylvania and continued until the end of November when rising local case numbers halted our services once again. We finished the year totally online with the exception of Christmas Eve which included a parking lot in-person service.

# Report of Church Council President, Dianna Schoenen:

We had an exciting start in January with a Congregational crockpot meal using our beautiful new kitchen. Looking back on that fellowship and meal together, with a crowded room of people, I am so grateful we had that time together! Who could have predicted that most of 2020 our sacred Sanctuary and Fellowship Hall would become empty and planning any event would take on a whole new meaning. I think we all have learned to appreciate the value of time spent with others!

Committees and groups met as usual January through mid-March, praying, crafting, planning, studying the Bible, reaching out to homebound members and the community, working hard and having fun with fellowship. We held a town hall meeting in February to hear about the hiring process of a new Pastor, which we assumed would soon lead us into a new Pastoral chapter. Youth group members attended Bear Creek winter camp, met with different leaders including Hope Lutheran's youth group We formulated our own plans for hiring an exciting new position of Youth Ministry Leader. What happened next needs no explanation. We all have our own personal experience of disappointments and sadness that may have occurred from mid-March to now. Along the way, church leaders listened to many on how we should or should not return to "normalcy", all while following CDC and PA state guidelines, to avoid spreading COVID-19.

But what about the new and positive experiences that DID happen?! We developed online worship with the traditional and contemporary service, started the phone-in option to listen to the service, plus we transmitted Christmas Eve through the radio in our parking lot! We will continue to stream our service to reach a broader community, even after in person worship returns with this wonderful, upgraded technology at Emmanuel's.

We learned how to do virtual or outside meetings which allowed Council, Bible studies, Outreach, Worship planning, Sunday School, Men and Women's groups, Confirmation, Cemetery, Property, Evangelism committee and more to continue serving God. These options can remain to meet in person or virtually in the future so all can be included!

Confirmation, youth and adult volunteering, summer and fall worship safely happened outside. Blessing of the Backpacks and Pets, 3rd grade Bible distribution, new members joining, first Communion and more still continued. A new Girl Scout troop and Eagle Scout Court of Honor still blessed our grounds!

Although we had differing opinions on how to handle the year, we learned to communicate, honor God and our Church Family in new ways. Whether through a virtual message, delivering food, sending cards, mailing Sunday school supplies, having a new "drop off" area for community donations, worshipping and even taking Communion at home as a smaller family, Zoom coffee hour, all done with respect for each other and with continued focus on health and safety.

What made Emmanuel's congregation special to you in 2020? Hopefully you found something that gave you spiritual joy and Peace in your hearts. Was it watching the musical team during Amped up Advent on Facebook? Worshipping outdoors in the fall? Returning to the church for smaller in person worship services? # 2020 Church Council Highlights... Kristin Butz, Council Secretary:

We opened 2020 by welcoming Justin Fallenstein and Chris Wolf as members of council. A Human Resources Committee was formed with Pete Coccetti, Barb Bennett, Justin Fallenstein and Wendy Whiteash being part of this committee. These committee members met with employees of the church virtually.

This year was unusual due to the COVID precautions that were put into place. A new COVID Reopening Committee was formed and would meet monthly to make sure the church was following all state and CDC guidelines for worship.

Call Committee - This committee met many times and in different ways, however all their hard work has not yet yielded a new pastor.

Cemetery - Karl Monroe has been the lead and had many volunteers to assist with taking care of our cemetery. Eagle Scout Colin Davidson was honored for the work he has done on our cemetery.

Outreach and Fellowship - Emmanuel's continues to contribute clothes, food and funds to the Bath Area Food Bank, as well as the glove and mitten tree at Christmas time donated to school children in Bethlehem. Small but dedicated volunteer crews came out for the spring and fall cleanups. Several members of the congregation turned out for a September Cemetery Work Day to help fill depressions and take care of untended plant growth.

Volunteers also took care of cutting back the super-abundant growth along the NE property line of the Union Cemetery. Another crew took on the perpetually rusting railings along the upstairs Sanctuary ramp access. Thank you all!

Special note of thanks goes to Bob Siegfried, who was able to take the time and, with his special skill set, have the property tax on our back parcel reduced to zero dollars. This parcel had been intended as expansion area for our current Mountain View Cemetery.

During the year, there were 11 burials and no plots were sold. The Cemetery Committee did not meet, but plan on starting up again when our lives edge back to normal.



#### Christian Education....submitted by Heather Bennett-Knerr:

Sunday School continues to develop using the Spark rotation curriculum. The program was off to a fabulous start from September 2019 until March 2020 when we stopped meeting due to the Covid-19 pandemic. We were learning so much about the Old Testament and our connection to God. This would not be possible without our students learning from different members of our congregation. They are able to build a relationship with others. A big thank you to all of the teachers!



Our program took another turn in November 2020. We started a virtual program that included mailings to the home. Thank you to Paulette Obrecht for developing a plan for our students to learn at home. The mailings include the lesson materials and art projects. Thank you for those that helped prepare the packets and monetary donations to support this new way of learning.

Vacation Bible School (VBS) was cancelled due to the pandemic. We hope to gather in the future with our theme Rocky Railway.

In the fall four of our Third Graders met on Zoom with Pastor Dan for *An Introduction to the Bible* and received their own copy of the Bible from Emmanuel's at our outdoor service on September 27. One of our youth attended classes for instruction about communion and received her First Communion on October 4.

The 2nd year Catechetical Class completed their studies with Pastor Dan in spring of 2020. Twelve of our young adults celebrated their Confirmation on Sunday, August 23 in a special outdoor service. The 1st year Catechetical Class began their studies in September via bi-weekly Zoom meetings with Pastor Dan.

The Ladies Bible Study and Men's groups have continued to meet weekly via Zoom. Pastor Dan offered a daily Devotional on Facebook during the Advent season.



# **COVID Reopening Committee....submitted by Michele Geiger**

The committee began meeting regularly in June 2020 with the goal of determining how to safely resume worship and activities at Emmanuel's. One of the objectives of our committee was to become familiar with guidelines as recommended by the State of Pennsylvania, the CDC and the ELCA in regards to

COVID-19 and a safe reopening process. In addition, we familiarized ourselves with what neighboring Lutheran churches were doing in regards to reopening.

In June, the decision was made to begin outdoor spoken worship services in July, which continued into October. These services were limited in attendance to allow for appropriate physical distancing. As the weeks grew colder, and the COVID cases lessened, the decision was made to move indoors. Due to guidelines recommending continued physical distancing, reservations were required as our attendance was limited. We alternated worshiping in the sanctuary and the fellowship hall. Throughout this time, our worship team consisting of Pastor Dan, Beth and Bobby, also prepared weekly online worship services that allowed us to worship remotely. We also registered for a special phone number to allow those without internet capability to call in and listen to either our weekly traditional or contemporary services. During these months, we permitted meetings to be held in the building as long as masks were worn and physical distancing was practiced.

As we moved in to November, we saw COVID cases spike, our hospitals were at near maximum capacity and we saw quite a few members of our Emmanuel's family contract COVID-19. In order to help mitigate the spread of the virus and do our part in helping to decrease the pressure on our healthcare system, we opted to temporarily suspend in-person worship, along with any church activities at least throughout the end of 2020.

We realize the decisions made by the committee were not always popular ones, but as mentioned, our discussions were serious, always done in a prayerful manner and any decisions made were based on the best information available at the time and always took the risks of our most vulnerable members into consideration. A survey given to our members in November provided us with some good suggestions and will be taken into consideration as we move forward.



#### Finance Committee Report ... submitted by Bob Siegfried, Treasurer

It has been a busy year for the Finance committee...

- In April, we applied for, and received, a federal government loan under the Paycheck Protection Program in the amount of \$34,570 which we used to continue paying all employees during the closure of the church due to the covid virus. Special thanks to Larry Kemmerer for tipping us off that as a church, we were eligible to apply. Thanks also to John Hemak who handled the application process for us through New Tripoli Bank. We subsequently filed the required documentation to request loan forgiveness, and it was approved. Thanks both to the proceeds of the loan forgiveness, and the continued generous giving on the part of our entire congregation, we continued to operate in the black all year, with sufficient income to cover all expenses.
- In June, we used the proceeds of a CD, originally purchased with the gift received from the Harry E. Grammes, Jr. estate, to pay down our mortgage by \$92,500 which will save us \$4,600 annually in mortgage interest.
- In July, we refinanced our mortgage with the Mission Investment Fund which reduced our interest rate by one half percent from 4.875 to 4.375, resulting in annual interest savings of \$2,000. Thanks again to John Hemak for handling this refinancing effort with the Mission Investment Fund. At the end of 2020, our outstanding mortgage balance was \$287,022 down from \$412,732 at the beginning of this year. Thanks again to everyone who continues to support the building fund and helping our congregation pay off this loan.
- In July, I prepared and submitted a Northampton County Application For The Exemption Of Real Estate Taxes on the 2.45 acre parcel directly behind our current cemetery along Valley View Drive. I did the same in 2006 and was successful in gaining exemption from real estate taxes, only to have it overturned a few years ago. I attended a hearing at the Courthouse in August, and we were once again granted exemption from real estate taxes on this property, which will save us \$1,300 annually.
- In August, we switched all our church insurance to a new company, Brotherhood Mutual, which allowed us to reduce our 2021 budget for insurance by \$1,200. Special thanks to Mellissa Dempsey for spending a great deal of her time conducting a comprehensive review of our current coverages and for securing significant coverage improvements in our new policy.
- In December, we worked with the Property committee to research air purification systems for the major gathering areas of the church. Special thanks to Karl Monroe for his help with this effort. We met with and received quotes from two vendors and made a recommendation to council at its January meeting where we received approval to move forward with installation. The devices are designed to kill bacteria, mold, and viruses both in the air and on surfaces.

Members of the Finance committee include Bob Siegfried, Treasurer, Bob Bennett, Financial Secretary, John Hemak, and council members Justin Fallenstein and Pete Coccetti.



# Ladies Zoom Bible Study....submitted by Gloria Wallery

Back in April 2020, I was feeling the need to visit with people. I missed our get together on Mondays at 10:30 with the Ladies. We had a group of 20 ladies coming regularly to the study then. Another church member reached out to me and we started to Zoom each other. (Thank you Yvonne!) So then I made an appeal to members to join me on Thursdays at

We had anywhere from 5-9 members meeting regularly. Then life got busy for some members and we started another Zoom opened to friends of the original members. We started on Romans in the Fall but we also do other topics and read other books besides the Bible. We read Daniel, 1 Peter, Blessings, Christmas and The Full Armor of God. We are not a closed group. It's open to others at Emmanuels. We Zoom on Thursdays at 10:30. The class runs about 80 minutes. 
#### Men's Group...submitted by Robert Splittgerber

# Outreach and Social Ministry Report...submitted by Andrea Roberts and Lynne Ambrose



In 2020 Emmanuel's Outreach and Social Ministries helped others beyond our expectations.

Emmanuel's Church has always had a giving heart extending ourselves beyond the walls of our church. That was again true this year in spite of the building being closed, Pennsylvania quarantining and social distancing guidelines. We put into action the words of the children's song, "the church is not a building, the church is not a steeple, the church is not a resting place, the church is the people." The people were still hard at work being the body of Christ during the Covid-19 pandemic. Emmanuel's members reached out to do their part in 2020 to fulfill Christ's mission.

Our congregation gave generously to various local and global causes and agencies; \$10,632 was used to help others this year:

- \$3582 was given to ELCA Good Gifts through our virtual Christmas Wish List to purchase cows, piglets, chicks, roosters, honey bees, fish and goats as well as water filters, blankets, Bibles, gardening tools and seeds, soap and sanitation supplies, and personal protective equipment.
- \$1770 was given to our social ministry fund, money used to help families and individuals in need.
- \$2359 was donated to support the Bath Area Food Bank along with many non- perishable food and other household or personal care items. The food bank serves about 120 families per month in the Bath area. A number of our members continue to donate their time by helping at the food bank.
- \$2207 was collected to support World Hunger appeals across the globe.
- \$714 and many non-perishable food items were collected for the food bank during the Souper Bowl of Caring held on February 2, 2020.

Beyond monetary donations, Emmanuel's members also strive to support each other and our community in a variety of ways:

- Our Birthday Card Ministry continues to brighten our members' "special day"... thank you to Linda Hoch for keeping this ministry going.
- Our mitten trees were once again overflowing with warm hats, gloves, mittens and scarves for children in need in the Bethlehem area school district.
- Over the summer we once again collected school supplies and personal care items for students at Behavioral Health Associates.

We also started some new projects this year despite restrictions due to the pandemic:

- God's Work Our Hands Women's Group began meeting with outreach as the main goal and the God's Work
  Our Hands Facebook page was created. Many of us also joined Light the Night Facebook page to pray and
  show support.
- Our youth and chaperones helped with the Kellyn Foundation Community Garden Project in Easton.
- We helped nurses at St. Luke's by donating clip pouches.
- We collected items for teens in Foster Care through ACCESS services.
- We donated items to the Hackerman-Patz House at Lehigh Valley Hospital.
- A crew from Emmanuel's helped a member of the community with the upkeep of his yard.
- We allowed a local youth football team to utilize our field for practice.
- Many of us have been calling other members to extend support. Many have been sending cards, letters and items to homebound members.
- Members have made masks and either donated them or sold them to benefit the church or other charities.
- Members helped to decorate the pavilion by painting butterflies, bird houses, crosses and rocks. The wooden
  painted crafts were shared with homebound members and given to Pastor Dan for Pastor Appreciation. Slate
  signs and rocks were painted with positive messages for the staff and anyone visiting Emmanuel's grounds
  during the quarantine.
- At Thanksgiving we helped local seniors by gathering small gifts for Meals on Wheels recipients in the area,
- Some of our members helped Covenant Methodist Church to fill boxes for Operation Christmas Child.
- Our group collected items and filled Christmas stockings for our homebound members. The stockings and poinsettias (which have become an Emmanuel's tradition) were delivered to help brighten the Christmas season for those unable to be with us.

It also should be noted that many members of Emmanuel's are active volunteers in the community including PTA, sports coaches/volunteers, Meals on Wheels, fire company, American Legion etc. They gave excess garden produce to the food bank and donated masks and bulbs to the Boys and Girls Club community garden. They helped pick up and distribute food donated by Shoprite to the community of Easton for the Boys and Girls Club of Easton.

Emmanuel's participated in God's Work Our Hands Sunday on September 13, 2020. This year we reached out to the Boys and Girls Club of Easton and gathered \$100 worth of cleaning supplies and monetary donations totaling \$325. We also helped with their community garden. In addition, we extended ourselves by supporting the Moore Township Police Department by treating them to lunch via the donation of gift cards.

In addition to all these gifts, we continue support of the ELCA and our Synod. Emmanuel's gave a generous tithe of \$37,000 in benevolence - which supports hundreds of ministries throughout our Synod, nation and the world.

When we total it all up, the amazing truth is this: Following Jesus' call, we are giving ourselves away by reaching out locally, regionally, nationally and to the ends of the earth. It feels good to be a part of a congregation that is making a difference as we grow together in Christ's love.

If anyone had told me last year at this time that it would be nearly a year until we'd all be together again for worship, I'd tell them they were nuts. Due to the pandemic, it will soon be one year since we've had normal worship services. We barely began the Lenten season when the world shut down and church was canceled. We have been very fortunate throughout this past year that we are blessed with a pastor and worship leaders who are able to lead us remotely in worship. From Palm Sunday to Holy Week services to Easter, to Thanksgiving to Advent to Christmas Eve and every service in between, we've been able to come together remotely as a church family and worship our Lord. We are terribly indebted to Pastor Dan, Beth and Bobby for the amount of time and effort they put into our weekly virtual services.

Beth provided "hymn sings" on Easter Sunday and Christmas Day by streaming some of our favorite hymns live on Facebook.

In addition, we appreciate those who have volunteered to virtually read lessons and offer prayer petitions weekly. Thank you, as well, to Lynne Ambrose who held us together this past year, as she was often one of the only staff in the building and wore many different hats.
