Greetings,

By now most of you have heard that we will begin in person worship inside the church building on June 6th as well as continuing to stream the services online. Some of you may have questions about what to expect when we gather. It would be difficult, if not impossible, for me to think of every question that may be on people's minds, but I'm going to address what I think are the two most pressing issues.

The latest guidance from the CDC regarding fully vaccinated people not wearing face coverings or maintaining physical distancing guidelines has caused confusion and raised a number of issues for organizations, such as Emmanuel's, that gather in relatively confined areas. Our top priority is to give everyone who wants to worship in the church the opportunity to safely do so. This means limiting the risk for those who are most vulnerable. There are some adults as well as younger children who cannot be vaccinated. Therefore, for now, everyone who attends worship will be required to properly wear a face covering that covers both the mouth and nose. The pastor and worship leaders will remove their masks when necessary.

Based on the current information we have to work with, the fastest way for us to get to the day face coverings won't be needed is for at least 70 to 80 percent of the population to be fully vaccinated. As of May 17th that number stands at 37% in Northampton County. **If you can get vaccinated please do so. Not only for your protection, but also for the well being of those who can't.** All members of the church staff are fully vaccinated.

The second issue is singing. The Hymn Society of the United States and Canada, which partners with the ELCA and other denominations, suggests that congregational singing not be restarted until 80 % of the population is fully vaccinated. But because everyone will be masked and with our new air filtration/purification system (which helps mitigate the spread of COVID 19 and other airborne viruses) installed we will be singing while masked. **I know that a number of you have been waiting for the day when there would be singing in church. For Emmanuel's that day has arrived! Please join us!**

One final point. As a faith community our concerns and motivations are not the same as businesses whose primary reason for existing is to generate a profit. We are here to help people grow spiritually as we deepen our relationship with God. Therefore our decision-making process is different. What is right for the church may not be right for business and vice versa. We have turned a corner, but there is still work to be done. I believe that the more we support each other, and put our personal desires on the back burner in order to meet the needs of others, we'll be living as Christ wants us to live. If you have other questions/concerns please let us know.

The jobs are not difficult and we try hard to work around individual schedules. If enough people are available we try not to schedule you more than once a month - but that only works if there are enough people willing to help.

This meeting was held via ZOOM for COVID precautions and also in person at the church with limited attendance for COVID precautions for social distancing

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by President Justin Fallenstein.

Devotions: Meeting was opened in prayer by Karl Monroe.

Review/Approval of Minutes: With corrections made it was moved by Karl Monroe and seconded by Kathy Milander to approve the minutes. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report:

- We need 2 lay delegates for synod. Registration is due by May 17, 2021. This will be held online on June 4, 5 2021. Information will be in the Informer and in the eNews. Pastor Dan will also announce it at services.
- Mission District Spring Assembly will be held on May 27, 2021 at 7pm on Zoom. Emmanuel's delegates for the Synod Assembly should attend this meeting.
- The Northern Lehigh Mission District is also looking for 3 people willing to serve as lay members on the Mission District Council which meets approx. 4 times a year.
- Lynne sent out a list of folks for council to contact and check on via phone calls.
- Constitution and By-laws continue to be reviewed with Pastor Dan, Karl Monroe, Kathy Milander and Bob Siegfried. They will meet to make revisions and get ready to send to the Synod.
- Pastor Dan will be on vacation from April 26 through May 2, 2021. He will be attending continuing education online on May 17 - 21.

Financial Secretary Report: Submitted by Bob Bennett.

Treasurer Report: Submitted by Bob Siegfried. Total offering continues to be down significantly compared to this time last year. We are down \$14,522 or 18.3% Expenses are up a bit, entirely due to February's snow removal costs. Fortunately it didn't snow in March. Total expenses through the end of March now exceed income by \$6,117 compared to a surplus of income over expenses this time last year of \$10,246. Building Fund contributions continue to be sufficient to cover our monthly mortgage payment.

Committee Reports:

Cemetery:

- Sales of cemetery plots helps perpetual care. Possibly looking into promotions to increase sales of plots.

COVID Re-Opening Committee:

- Hoping to have outdoor services, however we are unable to livestream from pavilion.
- Continuing parking lot services at 8 and 9:30am starting on April 18, 2021. These services will be live and prerecorded. Congregants can be in their cars or outside on lawn chairs. Still to be determined if Pastor can be outside for part of services. Distance for WiFi is an obstacle. Re-evaluate in May for possible to return to inside services, hoping by June.
- Next meeting May 11, 2021 at 6:30.

Evangelism Workshop:

- The first group has wrapped. Looking for a second group starting on April 13, 2021 7 pm at the church. This is an open door, anyone can join.

Outreach:

- April 19, 2021 at 6:30 will be watching a movie.
- April 25, 2021 will be after church paint and plant party.
- May 17, 2021 will be a Mother's Day Tea.
- The Easter egg hunt and making homebound blankets went very well.

Property:

- Church has been closed.
- Lawn services/snow removal services has been followed by Karl Monroe. Our current services are unable to lower costs. There are several other services that we are looking at to reduce our mowing costs. IKE has given a price of \$300 each for 20 cuts. Full cut every 10 days. If the season runs longer, \$300 each cut.
- In August, Council will be looking at bids for lawn and snow removal, and IKE is aware of this. It was moved by Paul Honett and seconded by Kristin Butz to accept this bid from IKE for mowing. Motion carried.

Worship:

- Next meeting to be held on April 15, 2021 at 8 pm.
- Palm and Easter Sunday services were held in parking lot.
- Holy Humor service will be held online at 9 am. Indoor service spoken at 9am. Pastor Dan will bring options to meeting.

New Business:

Sunday April 11, 2021 will be Brian Baylor's last day as security. Discussion of replacing him, versus having those who meet at the church lock up when they are finished. Bob Splittgerber has Men's group on Monday nights, and the Girl Scout leader to lock up on Wed. nights. Bob Siegfried will look into getting smart locks that can be accessed via cell phone.

Next Meeting: Next meeting will be May 13, 2021 at 7:00 pm.

Motion to adjourn made by Win Miller and seconded by Karl Monroe. Motion carried.

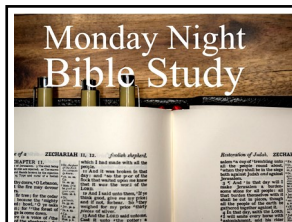

FROM THE EVANGELISM WORKSHOP

What is 'Evangelism'? Just like 'Evangelical,' which we Lutherans claim to be, the word 'evangelism' has something of a tarnished reputation in some people's minds associating it with pushy or scandalous or self-righteous Bible thumping

people who would by no means represent all churches which do evangelism and are called "evangelical." It is NOT about unsolicited confrontations with people, either.

'Evangel' comes from the Biblical Greek word for 'good news.' In Olde English it was called 'godspell;' today we say, "gospel." It was a common word for good news, but the Gospel of Mark, beginning a new literary form, gave it a new and specific meaning: "The Good News of Jesus Christ, the Son of God." Mark doesn't stop there. The Good News is the entire Gospel of Mark. No, it cannot be reduced to 'Love' or 'Love your neighbor.' It is the Proclamation of Jesus Christ crucified, the incarnate God bearing the Sin of the world, his resurrection, and reconciliation with God when we repent and receive the forgiveness of sins in his Name by the Grace of God through faith in what He has done for us.

But like Mark's entire Gospel and the other three which follow and the other writings of Scripture we call 'The Word of God,' it does not stop there. At the heart of the Gospel, though, is our new relationship with God in Christ Jesus out of which follows the entire Christian life. "He is Lord of all." He is Lord over everything we think, say and do, every aspect of our lives.

The Evangelism Workshop, in its second go-around and with a third to begin near the end of June, is about living this total devotion as members of the Body of Christ and helping us to comfortably live out and share with one another and others this message of salvation. Evangelism must begin with ourselves and the members of the Body of Christ gathered together at Emmanuel's before it can be carried anywhere else. It means nothing less than the renewal here of our Lord Emmanuel's congregation.

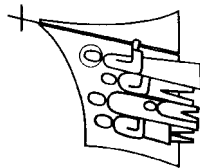
