Pastor's Word . . .

from Pastor Paulette Obrecht

In January and February we celebrate the season of Epiphany – a season which is considered "ordinary time" – but it is a time far from ordinary!

January 6 is the day of Epiphany – the 12th day of Christmas (with 12 drummers drumming). The word "epiphany" itself serves to alert us – for it means "manifestation" or "revealings" – of the true nature of God – as revealed to us in the person of Jesus.



I remember as I entered seminary 15 years ago and I had to be interviewed by the Synod's Candidacy Committee – one of the questions they asked me was "Who is Jesus to you?" It's a question that still stands out in my mind. As I took a moment to consider what to say, many thoughts ran through my mind. I not only wondered what it was they wanted to hear – but I also needed to figure that out for myself. Who is Jesus to me? Who is Jesus to you?

That's what the season of Epiphany is about. There's nothing ordinary about that! The seasonal scripture readings each Sunday reveal something new about Jesus – and, in turn, God – for us to spend the week reflecting on. From his baptism and first miracle at the wedding feast in Cana – to his return to his hometown of Nazareth and the calling of his disciples near the sea of Galilee. From his teachings about forgiveness and social justice in the Sermon on the Plain to his Transfiguration on the mountaintop where Moses and Elijah appeared, as God's voice blessed him from the clouds.

All of these revealings are meant to demonstrate to us who God truly is – and how God wants us to live – even though it might not be the way the world expects us to live. When God enters the world as we know it – God often brings about transformation and social disruption, too. Yet, Jesus came to demonstrate – to model – that for us. That's what I answered to the Candidacy Committee that day: Jesus is the model for the way I should live my life. It's something that's hard to do – but it's something worth striving for. What do *you* think?

The Bath Area Food Bank is always in need of monetary donations which stretch farther than any amount of food that we can give.






Piano Available

Volunteer Clearances - It's time to Update!

At the end of 2014 new laws took effect that required all employees and volunteers working with children to receive background checks every five years. These laws also put into place the new reality that our church volunteers are now mandated reporters if they become aware of or suspected abuse or neglect toward a child. The law requires these two background clearances for ALL mandated reporters every 60 months (5 years):

This year – 2022 – marks the time when most of Emmanuel's volunteers must update their clearances and turn them into the church office. A form describing the process for obtaining clearances can be found on the table in the back of Fellowship Hall. Volunteers who have obtained clearances for their employment may bring copies of those clearances for our files. If you have questions about this process or the laws requiring clearances, please contact Pastor Paulette or the church office. Some helpful links:






