## Pastor's Word . . . from Pastor Paulette Obrecht

Many times as I drive to Emmanuel's Church along a familiar road with steep hills and sharp curves, I am reminded of my first job as a school counselor, commuting from Bushkill Township to Stroudsburg High School along Rte 33. And, as I make the journey, the same thing that happened back then is the same as it is now. I leave my house thinking about all the unfinished business I'm leaving behind. Did I remember to turn off the coffee pot? Do I have my keys? And my cell phone? Then, as I reach the curves on Hokendauqua Drive – just before the hill to Emmanuel's Church ... I leave home behind and begin thinking about what lies ahead. What appointments and phone calls must I remember to prepare for? What's on my list of things to do. It reminds me, too, of the time I used to commute to Seminary classes in Philadelphia – and of the word I often used to describe it all: *liminality*.

Liminality is the state of being in-between – neither this nor that, neither here nor there, neither me nor not me. That's just what it was. There was something that was pulling me away from the expected to the unexpected. Why would anyone want to leave a job that one could perform comfortably and successfully to enter a state of the uncomfortable and the unknown? But, that's what I did as I made the decision to enter seminary. That's what I did when I answered the call to serve as interim pastor at Emmanuel's. In fact, that's what we all do when we begin something new ... leaving behind the old and comfortable and finding our way through the growth pains of the new. Mostly, we do it by choice ... but sometimes it is forced upon us by circumstances. When I work as a chaplain at the hospital, I realize that I witness many people who are in a state of liminality – families and patients who travel between the brokenness of illness or injury into lives that may never be the same again. Sometimes, it will be betwixt life and death itself.

As I commute back and forth to Emmanuel's in my shiny gold-green car – my Transportation Pod as my husband calls it – the vehicle that has become the extension of my life from the comforts of home to the unknown of doing God's work, and back again, I know it will be all right. In that voyage of betwixt and between, I have profound conversations with God who helps me set aside my concerns about family and household and self – so that by the time I pass Country Grapevine half-way up the hill, my mind shifts to focus on what I will be doing to serve God this day – whatever venture that might entail.

You know, Scripture has told us over and over that when people are in a state of being neither here nor there, that is when God is closest. And so, I can trust – we can all trust – that amidst our uncertainties God is there ... in the space between ... and all will be well.

And remember, I am with you always, even to the end of the age. — Matthew 28:20b

Donations for the food bank can be dropped off in the bins in Fellowship Hall or the upstairs Gathering Area.


Grocery gift cards (preferably Ahart's) are needed for emergencies. Please bring all gift cards in an envelope marked "Food Bank" to the church office.

The Bath Area Food Bank is always in need of monetary donations which stretch farther than any amount of food that we can give.


# **Third Grade Bible Class**

## Memories of Emmanuel's Church

Each month as we move closer to our 300<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration, look for an article from a member or friend of the congregation who recalls moments from the church's past. Here is the 1<sup>st</sup> installment, written by Louise Miltenberger, the oldest living member of our congregation, with help from her sons Jim and Jack.

#### I Remember When ...

- I took care of the nursery in the basement next to the old coal furnace and coal bin –
  it was black and dirty!
- The only way back up to the church was the narrow winding steps back up to the
  narthex, unless you wanted to go outside by way of the "New" Lady's and Men's
  Room. (by the way, this was a wonderful improvement compared to the outside
  outhouses, but we did have a Mens and a Ladies).
- We got the church brick-coated by a firm. It was fun watching them scrape off the new red coating they applied to the 1<sup>st</sup> coat white coating revealing the white mortar. They told us we had to have a silicone coating every seven years to protect it.
- We bought the schoolhouse across the street to further accommodate the upper class Sunday School (meaning the older ones).
- The schoolhouse was next to the carriage shed where the people could tie up their horses while in the service. This I was told, but I only remember arriving at church by automobile!
- The church picnics were outside on the west side of the church under the trees and we had a beautiful pavilion with sides that raised up like awnings. Birch beer and barbecue was the favorite. Oh yes, I forgot the ice cream!
- Lester Miller would always have his garden tractor with the beautiful canopy-roof trailer with a bench seat facing forward and one facing backward for the people to enjoy a leisurely ride down the road.
- Oh yes, I can't forget the "cake walks". If that green arrow stopped and pointed towards you you won! But I seem to remember that somehow nobody walked away empty handed. Funny how that worked out huh?
- Well, going back inside the church I remember during Bible School sometimes the older boys would get to ring the bell, but they would hang on the rope and up they went right off the floor and back down again and my boys were part of it!
- We had a Reformed and a Lutheran congregation with alternating services and ministers.
- Vacation Bible School "VBS": the kids always looked forward to Bible lessons with games and refreshments (Kool-Aid and pretzels what a treat at church!)
- Of course, back in that day I think we were related to almost everyone!
- It was always a pleasure to watch the children and older children at Christmas time in the evening reciting their memorized verses from the Bible, trying to get through it, pronouncing the words the best they could.. Afterwards all would get a box of chocolate for Christmas. My boys would always have empty boxes before we got home!

- The ladies would wear mostly little hats to church and a little "net" on the hat. Some would wear large hats, not many. I remember one in particular I pity the person in back of her! (hard to see the Pastor!)
- The heating grill in the center aisle would once in a while catch a ladies high heel leaving them to go forward for communion less one shoe!
- Everybody knew everybody; a close church family respecting one another

Some of these stories I am writing from my remembrance (Jim) and my mother's remembrance (Louise). It was a time when it seemed like the world was slower and things were easier. When we look to God and trust in him, he makes a way when there seems to be no way. God is good!



### First Communion Invitation

Our first communion classes will be offered on **Wednesday evenings, October 5 and 12 at7 pm**. We will meet in the old fellowship hall.

Students will receive their first communion on **Reformation Sunday**, **October 30** and are welcome to worship with their families at whatever service the family chooses. We will recognize all of the students by sharing their names at all of our services.



The class is open to students from second grade on up whose parents have decided that they are ready to receive the sacrament. The class will be taught by Pastor Paulette.

In the past, we have followed a suggestion made by the Lutheran Church in America more than 30 years ago to have students wait until they are in the fifth grade or about 10 years old. The ELCA is now leaving this decision up to individual congregations and their pastors. We have decided at this time to let parents work with the pastor to decide when is the best time for their children to begin receiving communion. If your child is younger than 2nd grade and you wish for them to receive communion, please contact the church office.

Communion is a gift given to us by Christ. We hope that gift will be cherished and understood as a gift from God. .

# **Help for Ukraine**



Our second GWOH project for 2022 involves collecting funds to provide humanitarian aid / medical supplies for Ukrainian refugees. We will be working in conjunction with St. Mary's Ukrainian Orthodox Church in Allentown and Assumption of the Virgin Mary UOC in Northampton. (The UOC is the equivalent of our ELCA)

Check out the "Christmas in the Summer" trees in our worship areas (upstairs and downstairs). The "ornaments" will have a monetary value along with a representation of what this amount will purchase. It will work just like our Good Gifts trees at Christmas.

Pick an ornament – provide a monetary donation/check for that item – and place it in the offering containers. Checks should be made to *Emmanuel's Lutheran Church* – earmarked for "Ukrainian Refugee Project."

All funds will be shared with St. Mary's Ukrainian Orthodox Church in Allentown (which is working with Assumption of the Virgin Mary UOC in Northampton, John Hnatow's church) – to be used for ordering medical supplies for Ukrainian refugee camps in Europe. 


