Dear Emmanuel's Church,

We are quickly turning the corner to Holy Week and the Great Three Days (or Triduum, if you like Latin) of remembering Christ's death and resurrection. I thought I would take just a few moments to re-remember why we hold these days in such special ways.

On Maundy Thursday, we remember Jesus' Commandment that we love one another, and pray that we may lead lives of humble service. We will hear the story of the Last Supper (complete with some **amazing** art from our young people), before the muchbeloved custom of Stripping the Altar. (This is a way we recognize and re-enact Jesus' being stripped of his robe before his sham trial and execution.)

On Good Friday, we will hear the story of the crucifixion from John's gospel, and then pray for the world Christ came to save. We will have the very familiar slow darkening of the worship space, ripping of the temple curtain, and removal of the Christ candle. You can also look forward to a new-to-us way of praying for the world for which Christ died. (Don't worry - it's nothing too crazy.)

I invite you to look in the newsletter for all the details of our Easter celebrations - everything from an Easter Dawn service to an egg hunt to the long-awaited return of the Easter breakfast. We have so many ways to celebrate the Resurrection on April 9th!

May Christ accompany you with hope and unexpected mercies as we prepare to proclaim once again that our God lives!

#### I Remember When ...

Walking into church always made you feel like you belonged, no matter if you were a member or a visitor. Everyone was friendly. But, my memories are mostly about music.

Several times I subbed as a pianist for the Adult Sunday School program. But, I considered the choir as my service to the church. Choir rehearsed every Wednesday, just like today. Geraldine Beil was the organist and choir director. Gladys Borger and I would sing duets and we also had a quartet of Bobby Lerch, Richard Beil, Gladys and me Being on the choir also allowed us to go over to Gracedale for talent shows we put on for the residents there. We sang our duets and quartets, along with Geraldine "tickling the keys". We also loved just singing in the church. And I remember another highlight of being in the choir was when we had a choir party at the Bennett's as a way to get better acquainted.

Another fond memory is when I was a helper for Luther League - the Youth Group of ages past. We had lots of good times. The one time I especially remember was when we were allowed to bring any vinyl record (you remember those) we wanted so we could play them at our party. Of course I had one I figured would provide a fun time. It was a polka record. They all asked, "What's a polka?" So, I showed them! By the end of the evening most of them managed to learn it and had their feet going the right way. It was really a lot of fun getting them to learn it. I also remember how Pastor Meck assigned all those confirmands to take notes during his sermons. I guess that was so they wouldn't talk while he was preaching. And, at Christmas time, the Luther League and choir, along with church members, would go out caroling together.

I have many good memories of being involved with music and with the youth of the church.


